

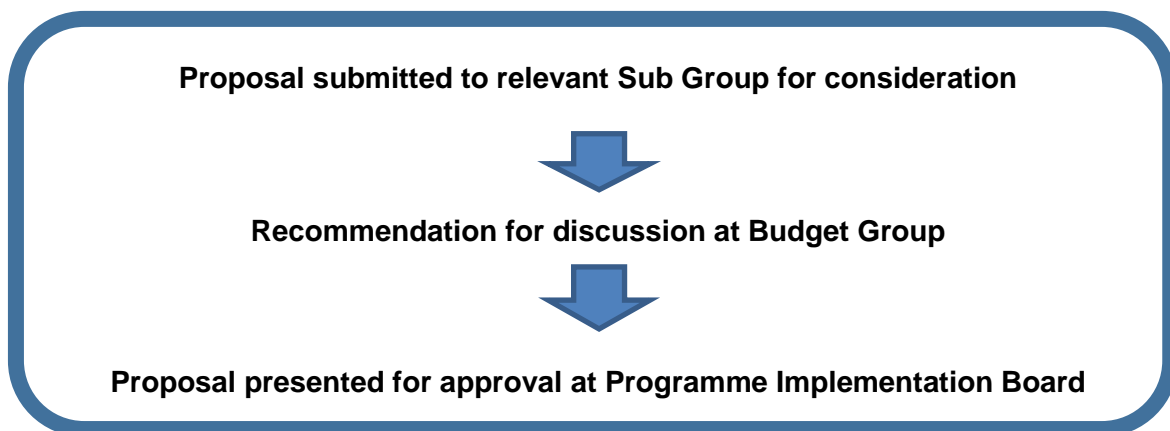
Overview of the Dublin North East Inner City Funding Process

The [Dublin North East Inner City \(NEIC\) Programme Implementation Board](#) was established in July 2017 under the chairmanship of Mr Michael Stone. The Board is working hard to support the vibrant community of the North East Inner City. The main activities of the Board are guided by actions set out in the [Mulvey Report – Dublin North East Inner City – Creating a Brighter Future](#).

Funding provided to the NEIC Initiative is allocated via the Programme Implementation Board Sub Groups:

1. Tackling Crime and Drugs;
2. Education, Training and Employment;
3. Creating an Integrated System of Social Services;
4. Improving the Physical Landscape; and
5. Addiction Treatment and Rehabilitation Services.

The process that has been agreed by the NEIC Board for decisions on funding proposals received is:



The process outlined above is not prolonged. Proposals can be approved for funding within 6 to 8 weeks.

The NEIC Programme Implementation Board welcomes proposals from community-based groups which are aimed at implementing recommendations set out in the Mulvey Report in new, innovative and collaborative ways. The preferable way to submit a proposal is through the North Inner City Community Coalition who have representatives on the Programme Implementation Board.
